

10,000 LIVES LOST IN TEXAS STORM, RAILROAD OFFICIALS SAY, 700 BODIES FOUND



DALLAS, Tex., Sept. 10.—From Virginia Point north and south along the bay front at such places as Texas City, Dickinson, Hitchcock, Seabrook, Alvin and intermediate points the number of dead bodies gathered up by rescue trains and sailing craft had reached at noon more than seven hundred.

Hundreds have been swept out to sea who never will be accounted for. The Houston and Texas Central Railroad officials, at noon received bulletins from their general office in Houston that the loss of life will reach 3,000 in Galveston.

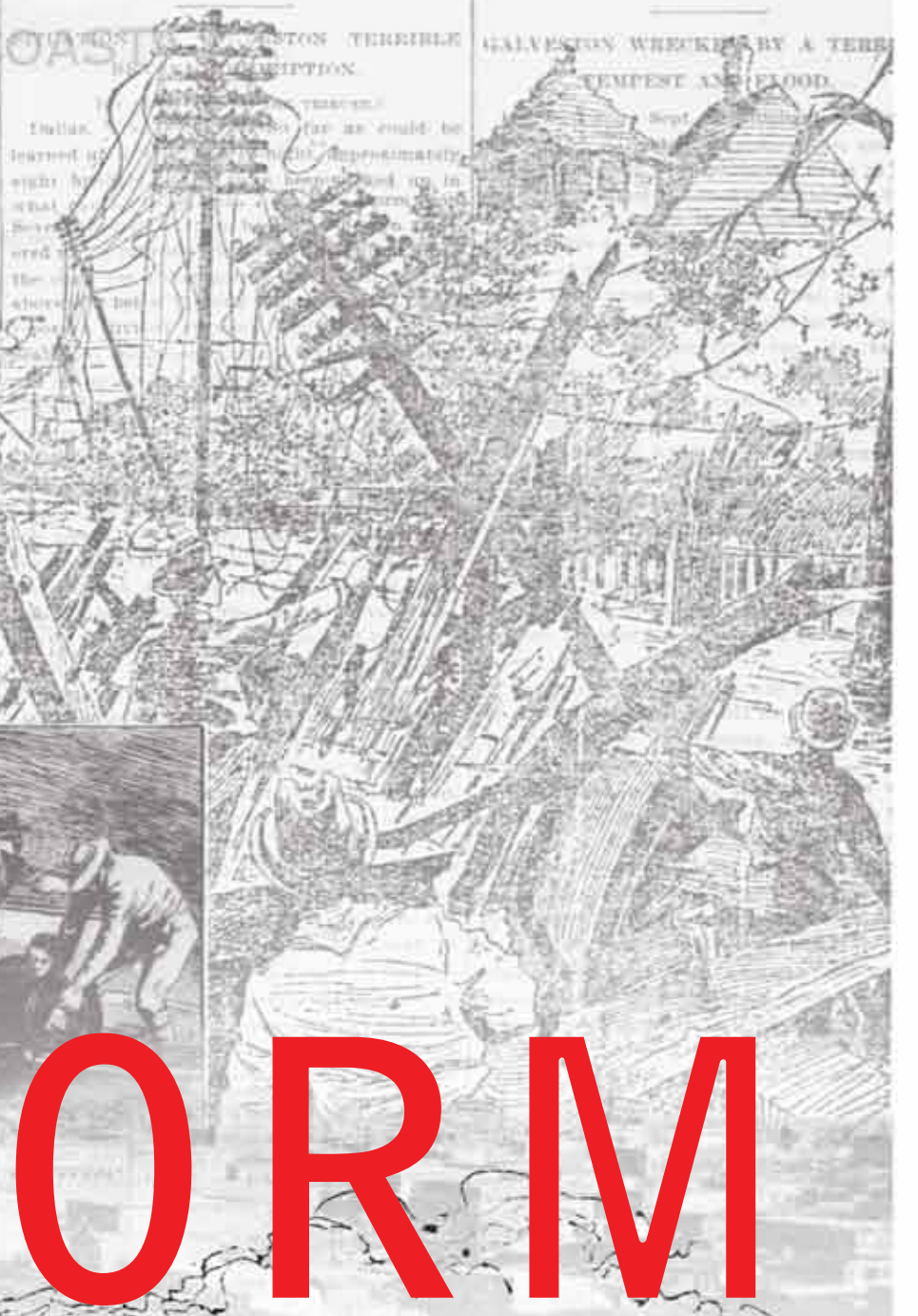
GALVESTON IN RUINS
